

252 Progression Award Scheme

The 252 award is designed to help you practise your shooting at different distances and recognise your achievements.

After 6 sighters, 3 dozen arrows are shot on a 122cm face at a chosen distance. The round can be shot at 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 80, or 100 yards with the aim of scoring 252 or better from a maximum of 324 using a recurve bow (alternative scores apply for other bow types). When you achieve the score twice you can claim your award.

This is an award scheme in use at many archery clubs in the UK and applies to all archers, irrespective of age, ability or bow type

The Rules

- 1 Archery GB rules of shooting apply. Six sighters to be followed immediately by three dozen scored arrows.
- 2 5-zone scoring using a 122cm face.
- 3 The three dozen arrows may be shot alone or as part of a longer recognised Imperial round
- 4 Badges may be claimed in any sequence.
- 5 Scores must be achieved twice to qualify the award
- 6 Qualifying scores for a given distance must be shot on different days.
- 7 To make an award claim 2 signed and witnessed score sheets must be submitted to the Records Officer.

The awards are as follows

Badges will be issued by the Records Officer and cost £1 each. The score sheets can be downloaded from the WCOA website.
